

# Soloist



Hok Kwan, born in Hong Kong, moved to the Maritimes in 1992, bringing decades of experience as a violinist, conductor, and educator. In 1990, he co-founded the Hong Kong Sinfonietta, one of Hong Kong's leading orchestras. He served as principal violinist with Symphony New Brunswick and the Saint John String Quartet (1992–2003) and was Concertmaster of Prince Ed-

ward Island Symphony Orchestra (2004–2024). Since 2017, Hok has been Artistic Director and Director of Orchestral Programming for the St. Andrews Arts Council.

In 2022, Hok became Conductor and Music Director of Symphonette by the Sea—sur mer. In 2024, he became Music Director of the St. Croix Chamber Orchestra, a cross-border ensemble that debuted in December. A Guildhall School of Music graduate in London, UK, Hok studied under David Takeno and has performed worldwide as a conductor and soloist, bridging communities through music.



Paul Bustin, alumnus of Mt. Allison University and the Opera performance program at Indiana University at Bloomington, has been featured in broadcasts on CBC Radio, Radio Canada, as well as National Public Radio (NPR).

Mr. Bustin has been a featured soloist with The Knoxville Symphony and

Indianapolis Opera and created the role of "Enrico Fermi" in *The Woman at Otowi Crossing* with Opera Theater of Saint Louis.

Symphonic performances include Mozart's *Requiem*, Faure's *Requiem*, Haydn's *The Seasons*, Handel's *Messiah*, Liszt's *Requiem*, Beethoven's *Ninth Symphony*, and Brahms' *German Requiem*.

Operatic roles include "Golaud" in Debussy's *Pelleas* et *Melisande*, "Zuniga" in Bizet's *Carmen*, "Leandre" in Prokofiev's *L'amour des Trois Oranges*, "Baron" in Verdi's *La Traviata* as well as both "Angelotti" and the "Sacristan" in Puccini's *Tosca*.

Italian Serenade Hugo Wolf (1860-1930)

The Austrian composer Hugo Wolf was a superb song composer, bringing the late Romantic *lied* into the modern age. [...] The new German lieder style that Wolf worked in was much influenced by Wagner. Songs were now expressive and dramatic, with an often-surprising chromatic sound.

#### Danse from Les Indes galantes

Jean-Philipe Rameau (1683-1764)

Rameau debuted his opera-ballet *Les Indes galantes* in Paris in 1735. In the fourth and final act, a French and a Spanish person in America compete for a young indigenous woman's attention, but she rejects both in favour of an indigenous warrior.

#### Five Ukrainians in a Bell Tower

Mykola Dmytrovych Leontovych (1877-1921)

The beautiful Christmas song *Carol of the Bells* is just over a century old. The music, based on a Ukrainian folk chant, *Shchedryk* (The Generous One), was written by Leontovych. The original lyrics tell of a swallow flying into a household to tell them of the wealth they will have in the coming year.

George Frideric Handel (1685-1759)

How is this for a description of Handel's famous Aria! "This sinister sounding bass aria is requited with hope! Dueling lines of melody, one a husky male bass, the other a light airy violin—stride together; one claiming darkness, the other dispelling it like a fairytale.

### The First Noel

#### Concerto Grosso in F minor, Op. 1, No. 8

Pietro Locatelli (1695-1764)

Italian violinist and composer, Locatelli was a master of the Concerto Grosso, a form that juxtaposes a small group of soloists against a larger orchestral body. Locatelli's Concerto Grosso is renowned for its dramatic contrasts, its thrilling virtuosic demands on the soloists, and its rich Baroque harmonies.

Jester Hairston (1901-2000)

In the early 1950s, Hairston was asked to provide a new Christmas carol. Using music with a calypso rhythm that he had composed a few years earlier, he wrote some Christmas-themed lyrics, resulting in "Mary's Boy Child."
